## STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

The present-day SAIS was formed in 1986 by a merger of the Mid-South Association of Independent Schools (1903) and the Southern Association of Independent Schools (1953). SAIS is a membership association serving independent schools in the Southeast, and is proud to be the largest regional independent school associations in the country.

SAIS has over 380 member schools from 14 states, the Caribbean, and Latin America They are unique, vibrant, and mission-driven.

Secular vs. Non-Secular: Of member schools, 51% are secular and 49% are nonsecular. For the non-secular schools, religious affiliations are as follows:
