

The impact on students and how schools can address it






Students are over 2x more likely to "almost never" speak to an adult about their social media experiences than they are to speak "almost daily."


TOP APPS USED WEEKLY

TOP NEGATIVE EFFECTS


SOCIAL MEDIA'S ROLE IN SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL HEALTH
