








Parker Palmer - The Courage to Teach


- Think of a Dream Innovation that you'd like to implement at your school.





Rethinking Cultures

- "That's not the way we've always done it" (Chapter 10)
 - "Rethinking is not just an individual skill. It's a collective capability, and it depends heavily on an organization's culture." (p. 207)
 - NASA and the Gates Foundation
 - Lacked cultures of psychological safety



Case Study exercise

- Humility What don't you know in this situation?
 - "If knowledge is power, knowing what we don't know is wisdom."
- Doubt What assumptions does your previous experience give you? Why might those be wrong in this crisis?
- Curiosity What information can you find out?
- Discovery What did you learn?



Recommendations, Wonders, and Discussion

- Recommendations
 - Practice tabletop crises with your teams
 - HGSE resource
 - Think like a scientist
 - Motivate through interviewing
 - Build psychological safety with teams
 - Consider connecting crisis to innovation
- Wonders
 - How can crisis change have lasting impact?
 How can the change not be associated with the crisis?
 - What best builds trust before the crisis?
